Student Success Classes

Intro to Online Learning

COLLEGE G050

1 unit

This course provides a basic introduction to computer concepts and online skills needed to succeed in a distance learning class. Students will be introduced to file management, word processing, email, communication, MyGWC, discussion boards, and Internet browsers.

Study Skills For College

COLLEGE G090

3 units

Learning skills necessary to complete developmental, vocational, and many lower division college courses. Learning styles, time management, taking exams, note-taking skills, memory techniques, reading effectiveness, and stress management will be covered.

Be a Successful Student

COLLEGE G100

3 units

This is a course designed to teach techniques and skills that can be used to succeed in college. Students will learn specific skills to enhance academic success and will develop their own action plans through self-evaluation. Additionally, students will learn and apply college level techniques for the use of resources.

Career Planning

COUNSELING G100

1.5 units

A course designed to assist students in developing intelligent career decisions. Standardized assessments, discussions and assignments will enable the student to clarify values, interests, abilities and personality characteristics that fit with possible career options.

Educational Planning

COUNSELING G103

1 unit

This course is designed to assist students in taking charge of their educational experience. Students will receive important information about college programs and success services, academic policies and procedures, an exploration of higher education in California and educational planning. Each student will develop an individualized student educational plan to meet their educational goals.

Career Planning a Holistic Approach

COUNSELING G104

3 units

This is an extensive career and life planning course within the broad perspective of psychological, sociological, and physiological theories. Emphasis will be placed on self-esteem/self-concept, values, motivation, gender and cultural issues in the workplace and global economies through a holistic approach.

Intro Library Resources

LIBRARY G110

1 unit

This is a librarian guided instruction course using a workbook, library print and electronic resources. The course is designed to introduce students to a variety of print and electronic information resources necessary for college level research. Students will demonstrate their skills development with weekly assignments using and evaluating library resources and materials.

Libraries and the Internet

LIBRARY G120

1 unit

This course introduces students to college level, online research, including how to locate, use, and evaluate information from the Internet. This course provides librarian guided study with student skills demonstration using library college research resources such as the GWC Library online databases and Internet resources such as online directories, virtual libraries, and search engines.
